Mrs. Justice Catherine McGuinness, Honorary President



Catherine McGuinness is a former President of the Law Reform Commission, a former judge of the Circuit Court (1994-1996), the first woman to serve on the Court, and justice of the High Court (1996-2000) and of the Supreme Court (2000-2006). In January 2012 Catherine was appointed to the Council of State by President Michael D. Higgins.

Virginia Kerr- Chairperson



A constant on the international stage, Virginia Kerr's career includes celebrated performances on the stages of the world's leading opera houses and concert halls and has taken her as far afield as Russia, Asia, Mexico and North and South America. Alongside a busy international performing career, Virginia Kerr is Professor of Voice at the Royal Irish Academy of Music and is on the vocal faculty of the National University of Ireland Maynooth. A keen interest in the workings of the psyche of musicians and performers led Virginia to pursue a Master of Science degree in psychotherapy with an emphasis on Musical Performance Anxiety. Virginia specialises in working with performers who suffer with performance anxiety and she incorporates this work into her performance psychology lecture series at the Royal Irish Academy of Music in addition to working privately at her private psychotherapy practice in Dublin.

Mark Armstrong



Mark Armstrong is one of Ireland's best known musicians with a wide-ranging career spanning over thirty five years. As a conductor he has immense experience on the concert platform and in the recording studio and has conducted many of Ireland's top ensembles, choirs and bands. As an arranger and composer Mark has created many works for choirs, orchestras and bands and is an award-winning published composer of choral music. He is a regular adjudicator at Irish choral music festivals and has acted as conducting tutor on courses conducted by the Association of Irish Choirs. Mark has held the position of Director of the Defence Forces School of Music since 2010 in the rank of Lieutenant Colonel with responsibility for the formation of Defence Forces musical policy, performance and training of Irish military and pipe bands.

Jim Fitzsimons has sung with many choirs, including Nas na Ri Singers, Kilkenny Arts Festival Chorus, Dublin County Choir and currently sings with Culwick Choral Society and Dublin City Choral Union.
